Session 1: Community College Pathways & Transfer Opportunities

She will discuss how community college can serve as a strong and strategic starting point for students, outline various transfer pathways to four-year universities, and explain transfer guarantee programs that help students successfully transition to their intended colleges.

Session 2: What's That School? Researching Colleges in the Application Process

Session 3: Navigating Critical Changes in College Admissions Testing

What is the difference between the ACT or SAT? What does a testing timeline look like? How do I prepare? What does test-optional vs. test-required mean for my student?

Practice Digital SAT & ACT Exam

Revolution Prep is now offering practice digital exams for both the SAT and ACT:

Families may schedule a free 30-minute score report review to help you interpret the results and develop a customized preparation plan. Los Angeles area high school students from all grade levels who are considering attending a U.S. service academy after high school or participating in an ROTC program while in college are invited to attend **Service Academy Information Night at St. Francis High School in La Cañada**. Parents are welcome to attend as well (with or without their children). The event will be held on **Thursday, March 5, at 7:00 pm, on the St. Francis HS campus**. 


Soup and Substance




This week marked the first Soup & Substance gathering of the Lenten season.
