

Alumni Service Award: Edgar McGregor '18




Last week, during our Catholic Schools Week Prayer Service, we were honored to present the Alumni Service Award to Edgar McGregor '18 in recognition of his extraordinary leadership and selfless service during the Eaton Fire.

Known to many as “Weather McGregor,” Edgar used his meteorological expertise to warn the Altadena community days before the fire, urging residents to prepare and evacuate as dangerous Santa Ana winds intensified. As the fire unfolded, his clear, urgent messaging helped families make life-saving decisions and evacuate safely.

Through calm leadership, courage, and a deep sense of responsibility to his community, Edgar exemplified what it means to live out our Lasallian values beyond campus. His actions are a powerful reminder that service rooted in care for others can truly save lives.
