### **TRACK & FIELD: (BOYS 2-0 league , GIRLS 1-1 league)**

#### BOYS:

- 3/11: La Salle 60 - Serra 45
  - Sprints / Relays / Hurdles:
    - The boys varsity 4x100 relay delivered a standout performance, running a PR and breaking the 44-second barrier, which now ranks as the third fastest time in school history for the event.
    - The hurdles crew had a dominant day with sweeps on both the boys and girls sides. In the boys 110H, La Salle finished 1st, 2nd, and 3rd with Jason, Simone, and Denzel leading the way. Jason Cheng also recorded a PR in the 300H with a time of 45.86.
  - Jumps:
    - In the field events, Elijah had an exceptional meet, winning the long jump with a PR of over 22 feet, leading a La Salle varsity sweep in the event.
    - In the triple jump, MJ captured the win with a jump of over 38 feet. River won the high jump.
  - Distance:
    - Outstanding performances from our freshman athletes highlighted the distance events. Matthew Perez and Marcus Hayes delivered strong races in the mile, scoring valuable points for the boys varsity team.
    - For the boys, Aaron Villalobos placed 3rd in the 800m with a time of 2:41, while Matthew Perez followed with a PR of 2:37 to take 2nd place in varsity.
    - A big shoutout to Aaron, Matthew, and Audrey for also

stepping up to run the 3200m, helping La Salle gain additional points and showing great team effort.

○ Throws:

- The throwers also had a strong day, highlighted by a varsity shot put sweep. Alex recorded a new PR to secure 2nd place.
- Most importantly, the throwers showed great team culture by supporting and hyping each other up throughout the competition.
- Overall, it was a complete team effort, with PRs, event wins, and athletes stepping up in multiple events to help both the La Salle Varsity Boys and Girls secure the team victories.

COLT CLASSIC RECAP:

- Dhiren Swamy earned an impressive second-place overall finish, while MJ placed fourth overall and recorded a personal record in the triple jump, improving his mark by a full foot. On the track, Miles Reid, Kai Hiro, Stephen Anderson, Alex Gonzalez added to the team's success by running a personal best in the 400 meters. These performances highlight the continued progress and competitiveness of La Salle athletes this season. Jacob Der delivered a strong performance in the **1600m**, running a **personal best of 5:23.17**. Jacob showed great pacing and determination throughout the race, finishing with a significant improvement and continuing to build momentum this season. Simon Schnaitman also had an impressive showing in the **300m hurdles**, clocking **48.36**. Simon attacked the race with confidence, maintaining good rhythm between hurdles and putting together one of his strongest performances so far. In the field events, Alexander Dencik competed in the **discus**, recording a throw of **89'0"**. Alexander continues to develop consistency in the ring, and this mark reflects the progress he's been making in his technique and strength.

GIRLS:

    - The hurdles crew had a dominant day with sweeps on both the boys and girls sides. On the girls side, La Salle finished 1st and 3rd in the 300H, with Jordan winning the event in 50.77, just barely missing her personal record.
  - Jumps:

- On the girls side, Maddie recorded a PR of 30 feet in the triple jump, while Makayla Ly had a strong day PR'ing in both the 100m and the triple jump. The high jump saw a great debut from Olivia Peterson, who cleared 4 feet in her first time competing in the event. Jocelyn had a dominant performance in the long jump, taking first place.
  - Distance:
    - In the 800m, Audrey and Sam led the way for the varsity girls, finishing 1st and 2nd and adding major points to the team score. Samantha also ran a strong mile and contributed points for the varsity team.
  - Throws:
    - In JV shot put, La Salle placed 1st and 3rd, while Olivia earned 2nd place in varsity shot put.
    - Most importantly, the throwers showed great team culture by supporting and hyping each other up throughout the competition.
    - Overall, it was a complete team effort, with PRs, event wins, and athletes stepping up in multiple events to help both the La Salle Varsity Boys and Girls secure the team victories.

#### COLT CLASSIC RECAP:

- Maddie Lovell also had a standout performance, achieving a personal record in the long jump by nearly a foot. Zoe Martinez had a strong performance in the 200m, running a personal record of 31.27. She attacked the curve well and continued to push through the finish, earning a well-deserved PR and showing great progress this season. Olivia Petersen competed in the 400m and ran a season record of 1:15. Olivia continues to build strength and endurance each meet, showing determination and steady improvement. Praise delivered an outstanding race in the 300m hurdles, running a personal record of 56.22. She competed with confidence and maintained a strong rhythm over the hurdles, a great sign of the work she has been putting in during training. The Girls 4x100 relay also had a solid race, finishing with a time of 53.06. The team showed strong effort and continues to improve their handoffs and overall chemistry as a relay group.
