  - Boys and girls varsity win the track meet !!
  - Great job to everyone who competed—this was a strong meet across all event groups. The effort, focus, and energy were evident from start to finish.
  - **Distance:**
  - Excellent performances from all of our distance runners. Both the boys and girls contributed valuable varsity points in the 800m, mile, and 3200m. Shoutout to Jacob Der and Matthew Perez for

leading the way on the boys side and helping secure key points. Special recognition to Jacob for a personal best of 2:18 in the 800m—great work. The distance girls also stepped up with strong races and important contributions to the team score.

- **Throws:**
- Outstanding day for our throwers. The girls took 1st place in shot put, while the boys secured 1st and 3rd in shot put. In discus, the boys dominated the field, taking 1st, 2nd, and 3rd. Great job to G, Wu, Mia, Dens, and Zach for finishing in the top three. Proud of the work and consistency this group continues to show.
- **Sprints/Hurdles:**
- Big performances from our sprinters and hurdlers. The boys 4x100 relay took 1st with a time of 45.08. In the 110 hurdles, the boys placed 1st and 3rd. Ayden won the 400 with a time of 54.7. Lyla placed 2nd in the 100 with a strong 12.83, and Miles also took 2nd in the 100 running 11.51. Denzel had a solid 300H race with a time of 44.56. On the girls side, Zoe Martinez won the JV 400 with a time of 1:09.
- Overall, this was a great meet and a strong step forward for our team. Let's continue building and stay locked in as we move ahead.

#### REDONDO INVITE ONLY RECAP:


- **Boys 4x1** – The group ran 43.96, which now puts them #4 in CIF. The handoffs were clean overall and the guys stayed composed in a competitive race. There's still room to tighten a couple exchanges, but this was a strong performance and shows the group is trending in the right direction as we move deeper into the season.
- **Dhrien (100m, LJ)** – Dhrien competed really well today and showed good race execution in the 100m. He stayed composed through the race and is starting to put the pieces together technically. In the long jump he competed aggressively and continues to show flashes of big potential. With more reps and consistency in his approach, there's a lot of upside and greatness coming for him.
- **Christian (100m)** – Christian had a solid race and ran very close to his PR. His start and acceleration phases looked good and he stayed competitive through the finish. He's right on the edge of breaking through to another PR, and with a little more sharpening he should be able to drop his time soon.

- **Denzel Carter (300H)** – Denzel executed his race plan really well. He attacked the hurdles with confidence, maintained rhythm between barriers, and competed hard through the final stretch. The race showed a lot of promise and he continues to demonstrate that he has significant upside as the season progresses.
- **Miles Wu (300H)** – Miles had a huge breakthrough with a PR of 42.38, which now ranks him #5 in CIF. He ran a very controlled race, stayed smooth over the hurdles, and finished strong. The progress he's making right now is impressive and shows he's moving into a very competitive level within the section.
- **Miles Wu (110H)** – Miles followed that up with another big PR of 16.14, also #5 in CIF. His hurdle rhythm looked much improved and he attacked the race with confidence from the start. Dropping time in both hurdle events in the same meet is a great sign of where he's headed.
- **Jacob Der (800m)** – Jacob stepped into a very competitive field and didn't shy away from the moment. He went out with the pack and competed against some of the best athletes in the state. He stayed strong through the second lap and finished well, which will be valuable experience for him moving forward.
- **Elijah (Triple Jump)** – Elijah focused on implementing some of the new mechanics he's been working on with our jumps coach. You could see him actively trying to apply those adjustments during the competition. He competed well and this meet served as a great learning opportunity as he continues refining those technical pieces.
- **MJ (Long Jump, Triple Jump)** – MJ competed well in both events and showed good effort throughout the competition. He's continuing to develop consistency in his jumps and the potential is clearly there. As his technique and rhythm continue to improve, we should start seeing some bigger marks.

Overall it was a really productive day. The athletes competed hard, gained valuable experience, and we saw several major PRs along with strong performances across multiple events.
