- Another strong showing across all event groups, highlighted by big performances, personal bests, and competitive finishes across the board.
- Boys La Salle Varsity secured the team win and are your **2026 Del Rey League Champions.**
- **Sprinters / Hurdlers / Jumpers**
 - The sprints, hurdles, and jumps group set the tone early with a series of standout performances. Michael Johnson led the way in the high jump, clearing an impressive 5'9 to take 1st place, while Praise Nkanu also captured 1st by clearing 4'4. Simon competed in the pole vault, clearing 10'6 and continuing to build consistency in the event.
 - In the horizontal jumps, Jocelyn Allen delivered a strong triple jump of 32'1 to earn 2nd place, while Dhiren Swamy dominated the event with a winning mark of 40'4.
 - On the track, Jordan Anderson put together an excellent race in the 100H, running a PR of 17.19 to secure 1st place. The boys 300H group showed depth and strength by sweeping 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, with Denzel Carter highlighting the group with a PR of 43.90 for 2nd place. Zoe Martinez added another strong performance with a PB of 1:08, and the girls 4x1 capped it off with a season-best time of 52.09.
- **Throwers**
 - Girls placed 2nd in shot put
 - Boys placed 1st and 3rd in shot put
 - Boys varsity took 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in discus
- **Distance**
 - Great job to the distance team for putting together some

strong races. Both the girls and boys teams showed up and delivered.

- Huge shoutout to Jacob for an incredible performance in the mile, dropping a massive personal best with a 5:11 finish. That is a big milestone.
- On the girls side, Liv crushed the 800m with a huge PR of 2:45, showing great effort and continued progress.

- 3/20-3/21: California Relays

- This weekend was a huge step forward for our program, highlighted by multiple personal records, a new school record, and strong performances across every event group. The work we've been putting in is clearly showing on the track & field.
- On the sprint side, Ayden Martinez led the way with a big personal best of 11.38 in the 100m, while Miles Reid followed up with a strong PR of 53.30 in the 400m. Our hurdle crew had an outstanding weekend, with every athlete setting a new personal record. Denzel ran 17.68 in the 110 hurdles, Jason Cheng clocked 18.51, and Miles Wu ran 41.79. On the girls side, Jordan Anderson set a new PR of 17.37 in the 100m hurdles and came back in the 300m hurdles with a PR of 49.81, alongside Praise Nkanu who also PR'd with a 54.52.
- In the relays, our boys 4x200 team of Christian Slammat, Ayden Martinez, Elijah Loayza, and Miles Reid delivered a historic performance, breaking the school record and moving to #1 all-time with a 1:30.11. The 4x400 team of Christian Slammat, Miles Reid, Miles Wu, and Ayden Martinez also had a strong showing, running a season best of 3:42.90. Our sophomore and freshman boys 4x200 group ran an impressive 1:45.04, placing well and continuing to build momentum.
- Field events also saw major improvements, with Denzel clearing a personal best of 5'2 in the high jump. Mia Bella Resnick set a new PR in the shot put with a throw of 30'10, and Jocelyn Allen jumped a personal best of 16'8.25 in the long jump.
- On the girls sprint side, Catherine De Los Reyes (1:05.22) and Praise Nkanu (1:06.19) both earned PRs, while Makayla Ly added another with a 14.31 in the 100m. The girls 4x400 team of Catherine De Los Reyes, Lyla Davis, Praise Nkanu, and Jordan Anderson capped off the meet with a strong PR of 4:32.98.
- In distance, Matthew Perez delivered a standout performance in

the 1600m, running a personal best of 5:53 in the freshman-sophomore division. His consistency and dedication continue to pay off. Giselle Le Duff also had an excellent race, earning a PR of 6:55 in the mile and showing great progress and determination.

Overall, this was one of our strongest meets of the season. The energy, competitiveness, and growth across the team are exactly what we're looking for as we continue to build momentum.
