 - Our boys distance athletes had a strong showing at yesterday's dual meet against Bishop. Leading the way was Jacob Der with an outstanding performance in the 1600m, setting a new personal record of 5:23.90. Matthew Perez also had a great race in the 1600m, earning a personal best of 5:58.07.
 - **Sprints /Relays :**
 - Dhiren Swamy captured the long jump (20-5) and placed 2nd in the 100m.

 - The Boy's Varsity 4x1 Christian Slamat, Dhiren Swamy, Ayden Martinez and Miles Reid had a strong start by breaking last years 4x1 time at their first meet
 - Dhiren and Ayden went on to PR in the 100, and Miles in the 200/400. Christian in the 100 and 200 with a time of 22.69 (#4 all time for La Salle).

 - Freshman Lyla Davila had an incredibly strong start running Varsity in the 100/200.
