


Join Us for the 29th Annual Lancer Invitational!

Who are the BEST of U Consortium?

We are a group of 5, top-ranked UK and World universities ([Bristol University](#), [Durham University](#), [Newcastle University](#) [Queens University Belfast](#), and the [University of York](#)) who travel together throughout the USA informing students of the opportunities and benefits of studying in

the UK. We are all members of the Russell Group – often referred to as the UK’s Ivy League.

Why are we hosting an event?

In recent years, the UK has become an increasingly popular option for US students wanting to study abroad for their full degree. This is mostly because of the time and cost savings that can be gained from our intensive 3-year bachelor's degrees, as well as the international experience we offer on our campuses and the ability to explore the rest of Europe whilst living and studying in an English-speaking country.




BOYS WATER POLO: (8-5 ; league 0-0)

CROSS COUNTRY:

- The cross country team competed at the Woodbridge Classic Invitational, a national race over 2 days featuring over 16,000 athletes, on Friday, September 19th. Under the lights and stars, the team came out

swinging. Across the 9 events, multiple athletes crossed the finish line earning themselves medals for finishing top in their respective races. The night started with the Boys novice race, 5 of the 6 athletes either matched or earned Personal Bests, then our girls stepped up to the line. Our top female athlete in this race, Giselle LeDuff, finished in the top 9% of the race with over 600 athletes. The boys then set the stage, with each grade level earning at least one medal per group. Freshman Steven Chang, 75th with a 19:19, Sophomores Finn Sternlicht and Jacob Der, 79th, 18:53 and 84th, 18:51 respectively, Junior Oliver Chew, 70th with an 18:52, and Senior Joshua Garza, 79th, at 17:51, all fought to earn the top spots for our team. On the girls side, Freshman Camilla Villegas, finishing 28th with a 23:32, and Sophomores Liv Gonzalez and Rythym Basurto, finished 19th with 21:14 and 52nd with 22:53, respectively. The whole team pushed themselves and earned great finishes in their races and with the league races as the next target, we are looking forward to seeing continued success.


