### **Academic Support Pilot Schedule**

Beginning April 20, we will launch a pilot bell schedule that places Academic Support (AS) at the end of both A-Days and B-Days. Only

## Key Details

- The school day will remain the same and will continue to run from 8:15 AM–2:45 PM.
- Academic Support time: A-Days: 25-minute AS block, B-Days: 65-minute AS block
- Academic Support offerings will remain consistent
  - All teachers will continue to be available for academic help.
  - Independent workspaces and student collaboration areas will still be provided.
  - Students on the MAS list will still be required to attend.
  - Students may continue to use this time for tutoring, assessment corrections, and missing work.
- Structured space for students who are up to date with all assignments and assessments may report to the gym or another designated supervised area until 2:45 PM. These students may use this time for quiet study, reading, collaboration, or school-approved activities.
- Handbook Policy Still in affect: *“To be eligible to participate in co-curricular activities (sports practices, games, dances, retreats, theater performances, etc.) a student must be in full attendance at school on the same day as the scheduled event or on the last day of the week if the event is on the weekend.”*

## Why We Are Piloting This Schedule

1) Strengthening Student Learning: Our primary goal is to maximize student learning during the most productive parts of the day.

- Research and classroom experience suggest that students are generally more focused and academically engaged earlier in the day.
- This adjustment reduces interruptions to the academic flow of the day and creates more consistent class periods.
- Students can then use AS after experiencing the day’s lessons, allowing them to seek help while the material is still fresh in their minds.

2) Improving Access to Teacher Support: Placing AS at the end of the day creates more intentional opportunities for students to receive help.

- They can come to AS with specific questions from lessons, homework, labs, projects, or assessments given that day.
- Teachers can provide more targeted support because students will know exactly where they need clarification.

3) Gathering Feedback for Future Scheduling: This pilot is also an important step in planning for next year.

- The trial will help us collect student, teacher, and family feedback.
- We will be able to identify what is working well and what may need adjustment.
- Through the use of our Flexisched Software, data from attendance and student use of AS will help guide future decisions. This gives us the opportunity to make thoughtful refinements before considering a long-term schedule for the fall.

4) Supporting Student Health, Wellness, and Family Flexibility: We also want this schedule to better support family life and student wellness.

- Students who are caught up academically may be able to leave for medical, dental, therapy, or personal appointments without missing classroom instruction time. Families will have greater flexibility in scheduling appointments later in the day.
- This helps reduce the stress of missing important classroom lessons for outside commitments. Students can maintain stronger attendance in academic classes while still balancing personal responsibilities.

5) Encouraging Student Responsibility and Time Management

This structure also reinforces positive academic habits.

- Students who stay current with their work are rewarded with greater flexibility and structured independent time.
- The model encourages students to stay organized and meet deadlines and it helps students develop self-management, planning, and prioritization skills that are essential for college readiness.

- The La Salle boys' tennis team has officially cemented its place at the top of the Del Rey League once again. With a perfect **9–0 record**, the Lancers secured their **third consecutive league championship**, overcoming early-season uncertainty to deliver one of the program's most impressive runs to date.
- “It means a lot,” said Coach Javier. “We started off so bumpy—to the point where I thought we weren't even going to be able to compete. To turn that into an undefeated season so far... it made me feel justified in the decisions I made early on, especially the tougher ones.” The defining moment of the season came in a tightly contested **10–8 victory over Bishop Montgomery High School**, a match that ultimately secured La Salle's position as the top team in the league.
- “All five of my seniors have been with me since their freshman year,” Coach Javier said. “It's going to be bittersweet when the season ends. They've been through a lot with me, and I'll forever be grateful for everything they've done for this team.”
- Beyond the results, this season has been defined by the team's chemistry and connection. “It's been good,” Coach Javier said. “This team, although new in some ways, has been flowing well together all

season. That was definitely the difference maker in the match against Bishop Montgomery, and it's going to be the key to our success going into playoffs.”

- This year's title run is a testament not just to talent, but to resilience and belief. After roster turnover and early adversity, the Lancers stayed committed to their identity—prioritizing team chemistry, accountability, and trust in one another.

- Boys La Salle Varsity secured the team win and are your **2026 Del Rey League Champions.**
- **Sprinters / Hurdlers / Jumpers**
  - The sprints, hurdles, and jumps group set the tone early with a series of standout performances. Michael Johnson led the way in the high jump, clearing an impressive 5'9 to take 1st place, while Praise Nkanu also captured 1st by clearing 4'4. Simon competed in the pole vault, clearing 10'6 and continuing to build consistency in the event.
  - In the horizontal jumps, Jocelyn Allen delivered a strong triple jump of 32'1 to earn 2nd place, while Dhiren Swamy dominated the event with a winning mark of 40'4.
  - On the track, Jordan Anderson put together an excellent race in the 100H, running a PR of 17.19 to secure 1st place. The boys 300H group showed depth and strength by sweeping 1st, 2nd, and 3rd, with Denzel Carter highlighting the group with a PR of 43.90 for 2nd place. Zoe Martinez added another strong performance with a PB of 1:08, and the girls 4x1 capped it off with a season-best time of 52.09.

  - Great job to the distance team for putting together some strong races. Both the girls and boys teams showed up and delivered.
  - Huge shoutout to Jacob for an incredible performance in the mile, dropping a massive personal best with a 5:11 finish. That is a big milestone.
  - On the girls side, Liv crushed the 800m with a huge PR of 2:45, showing great effort and continued progress.
