Wellness Day on Wed, April 29, from 11:10 am to 12:15 pm

Dear parents, we are excited to share that our annual Wellness Day is taking place on Wednesday, April 29! Students and faculty/staff will enjoy a day full of fun and engaging activities.

We will begin with a **Wellness Assembly** (11:10 AM - 11:40 AM) featuring a calming soundbath experience, followed by **Wellness Stations** (11:40 AM to 12:15 PM). Activities include a petting zoo (bunnies, mini cow, piglet, goats, alpacas), goat yoga, Maverick the therapy dog, arts and crafts (lanyard making, mandala coloring, and origami), mindfulness sessions (connection through movement and emotional grounding), portrait painting, meditative coloring, and a 3-on-3 basketball tournament.

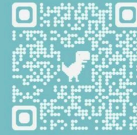

- The Lancers showed up ready to compete, and the results reflected that across multiple events.
- We had a great start with Matthew Perez, who delivered a strong performance in the Boys Varsity 1600, earning a PR of 5:52.34.
- In the Boys 110m hurdles, the entire group qualified for finals, which was a huge statement for our program. Miles Wu leads the field heading into next week with the fastest qualifying time of 16.02, followed by Denzel Carter at 17.45 and Jason Cheng at 18.14.
- On the girls' side, Zoe Martinez qualified for finals in the JV 400 with a time of 1:09.76, continuing to build momentum. In the Boys Varsity 400, Miles Reid also advanced with a solid 53.60.
- The Boys 300m hurdles will be another highlight event for us in finals. Miles Wu and Denzel Carter are currently sitting 1st and 2nd overall with times of 42.18 and 42.54, respectively, and Jason Cheng also secured his spot in finals with a 46.31.
- We also saw some big personal bests today. Ayden Martinez had an impressive PR in the 200 at 23.15, and Jacob Der made a major breakthrough in the 800 with a huge PR of 2:15.
- In field events, Olivia Petersen had a strong showing in the Girls JV High Jump, earning 2nd place with a mark of 4-0.
- Overall, it was a very successful day with multiple qualifiers, top-seeded performances heading into finals, and significant personal improvements. The team is in a great position going into next week, and we're excited to carry this momentum forward with our relays , varsity field events and girls varsity hurdles !
