Leadership Message

A Year of Growth, Gratitude, and Promise

As we approach the close of another remarkable school year, I want to extend my heartfelt gratitude to our students, families, faculty and staff who continue to make our Lasallian community such a vibrant and faith-filled place to learn and grow. This year has been marked by achievement, service, and joyful celebration.

Whether in the classroom, on the athletic fields, on the stage, or through service projects in the

community, our students have demonstrated what it means to be young men and women of faith, service, and community.

Highlights from the 2025-26 School Year:

- 163 graduates from the class of 2026 celebrated their commencement at the historic Pasadena Civic Auditorium. 100% of the class will be attending college. Highly selective destinations include: USC, UCLA, UC Irvine, Pomona Pitzer, Claremont McKenna, LMU, NYU, Johns Hopkins, Tufts, Brown, Boston College, and Carnegie Mellon, among others.
- **Faith Based Education and Mission Inspired Service Learning:** Countless service hours were devoted to many causes including: Riley's Race for Change, Christmas Tree Sale, Adopt-A-Family, Catholic Schools Week Service, Blood Drive, and the Box of Love Drive. Additionally, monthly liturgies and retreats continued to play a main role in school programming.
- **Academics:** Our students continued to academically excel in the classroom and beyond. The Academic Decathlon team captured several awards at the World Scholars Cup in Slovenia; Senior Noah Leiva participated in the prestigious United States Senate Page program, a program giving students a glimpse of the inner legislative workings of Washington, D.C.; The Mock Trial team had another successful season with senior Violet Tran being named the All County MVP; Cory Lai was named a finalist in the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test; LSCP was designated by the College Board as an AP Platinum School, meaning the school had over 80% of graduating seniors successfully complete at least one AP course, with at least

50% of those seniors earning college credit by scoring a 3 or higher on an AP Exam.

- **Athletics:** The Girls Golf team and Girls Basketball team captured CIF-SS titles. For the girls basketball team, it was their third sectional title in five years. Teams capturing league titles included: Girls Golf, Girls Volleyball, Girls Tennis, Boys Tennis, Softball, Boys Swim, and Boys Track & Field.
- **Performing Arts:** Standing ovations also go out to our performing and visual artists. From the Fall production of *Trap*, to the Spring musical *Lucky Stiff*, the Winter Dance Concert Trust Fall, the visual arts shows, the jazz and strings concerts, and everything in between, it was a great year in performing and visual arts. Our drama production of *Lucky Stiff* has been nominated for 15 John Raitt Awards for Youth, and our visual artists received 5 National Scholastic Art and Writing achievement awards. Congratulations!

As our graduates prepare to begin the next chapter of their journeys and our rising students look forward to moving up a grade, we are proud of all they have accomplished and confident they will continue to make a positive difference in the world.

At the same time, we are excited to welcome the incoming Class of 2030 and transfer students. The enthusiasm and energy of our newest students remind us of the bright future ahead for our school. Throughout the admissions process, we were inspired by the talents, character, and potential

of the young people and families seeking to join our Lasallian mission. We eagerly look forward to helping these students grow academically, spiritually, socially, and personally over the next four years.

As the summer begins, I encourage all students to take time to rest, recharge, and enjoy meaningful time with family and friends. Summer is also an opportunity for growth. I encourage students to continue reading, stay active, explore new interests, volunteer in their communities, and maintain healthy routines that support both physical and emotional well-being. Even small daily habits can make a significant difference in preparing for a successful school year ahead.

Already, we are looking forward with excitement to the 2026–2027 school year. New programs, fresh opportunities, campus renovations and continued growth await us as we build upon the strong foundation of our Lasallian tradition.

At this point, most seniors should have submitted their deposit to the college where they plan to attend and have notified the colleges where they declined admission offers.

If your student has changed their mind regarding the college they will attend, please inform Mr. Hou and update Scoir. We want to ensure final transcripts are sent to the correct college.

JUNIORS

College Planning - Visiting Colleges

When planning schools to visit, we recommend that families select a variety of schools, including safety and target schools. If it is not possible to travel to visit schools, just visiting the ones close by that are different from each other will already be beneficial. We recommend using this [College Visit Handout](#) as a guide for factors to note during your visit and questions you may want to ask your guide. You may also join virtual tours and information sessions. Below are very helpful websites to assist with

your research:

- Bigfuture.collegeboard.org Customizable college search tool through College Board
- Youvisit.com Take virtual tours of over 600 campuses
- Niche.com Customize college searches based upon a set of criteria set up by the user
- Campusreel.com Student-generated videos from the schools they attend

This research will help finalize a balanced list of schools where rising seniors may apply to in the fall.

Class of 2027 College Planning Survey

The Class of 2027 will be able to complete the College Planning Survey for Seniors at the beginning of fall. Rising seniors will have time to reflect on the questions and their answers, and to submit their survey electronically by September 4.

Meetings with College Counselors for College Planning

Counselors will be meeting with all students again in the fall for their senior college planning meeting. Your counselor will meet with you for a deeper discussion about your college plans, provide strategies for your applications, and support you through all aspects of the college process.

Letters of Recommendation

- The process has been opened early to give you ample time to

work on your brag sheets.

- All rising seniors, regardless of their application deadlines, are required to request one **teacher's letter of recommendation by October 1.**
- Similarly, you are required to complete the **"Brag Sheet for Counselor Letter of Recommendation"** by October 1. No request is needed for the counselor recommendation.

Steps:

1. Ask your teacher in person first. We encourage you to choose a teacher who knows you well, preferably a recent teacher from a core subject area or a course related to your intended major.
2. Submit a request in Scoir. Please do not skip this step, or your teacher will not be able to view your account. **Go to: [Scoir](#) > [My Colleges](#) > [Docs](#) > [+Teacher](#) > [Submit](#)**
3. Complete the brag sheets on your Scoir homepage.
4. Please indicate your first application deadline in the brag sheet. If there are any changes to your deadlines, you must notify both your teacher and counselor, as we do not receive automatic alerts for deadline changes.

Summer

- This summer represents one of the final opportunities to build accomplishments and experiences that you can share with colleges before submitting your applications in the fall. It is a great time to pursue leadership roles, responsibilities, volunteer work, enrichment opportunities, and employment experiences.
- Start drafting your college essays for the [Common App](#) and/or [UC](#) applications. The prompts

and requirements are already available online. Your essays are an opportunity to showcase your passions, insights, personal growth, and who you are beyond grades and records.

- Begin working on your college applications early. The more you complete during the summer, the lighter your fall semester workload will feel. The Common App and UC applications open on August 1. Start with these applications first, as they typically require more time. The [Cal State](#) application opens on October 1.
- Continue exploring and finalizing your college list. Summer is a wonderful time to travel and visit campuses near and far to determine what factors are most important to you, what would be nice to have, and what may not be the right fit. You can use this [handout](#) to help guide your questions during college tours.
- An added benefit of finalizing your college list early is understanding your deadlines and application requirements so you can better pace yourself throughout the fall. Be sure to have a well-rounded list of reach, target, and safety schools.
- La Salle students receive priority admission consideration for Cal State LA and Cal State Northridge.
- Lastly, and equally important, find time to rest, recharge, spend time with loved ones, and enjoy hobbies simply for the fun of it.

Save the Date! College Night for Seniors (Class of 2027)

The next college information meeting for parents will take place on August 27th at 5:30 PM before Back to School Night. We will be reviewing with you the very relevant information necessary for



college applications. Students will receive the same information as well during class meetings we have planned for them.

Standardized Testing

Many schools will be making a final decision about test scores and whether or not they will be optional as many were for the previous classes. For up-to-date information on schools that are test-optional, please visit the [FairTest](#) website.

The UC System no longer considers standardized test scores. The scores may, however, be used for class placement once students are admitted. For more information, please visit the [UC Admissions Requirements](#) page.

Likewise, the Cal State system is no longer considering standardized testing for admissions, but it may be used for class placement upon admission. For more information, visit the [Cal State Freshman Test Requirements](#) page.

For test-optional schools, we recommend students take either the SAT or ACT and then decide whether they wish to report their scores. Rising seniors may also take the exam in the fall. Check with your college of interest for their last accepted test date.

Both sessions are now full. We are excited to support rising seniors as they prepare their college essays this summer. The purpose of this three-day workshop is for rising seniors to get a head start on the college application essays by brainstorming ideas and coming up with at least the first draft.

Students will also participate in a case study in which they will review complete college applications and learn from an actual admissions officer the process they go through to make admissions decisions. **Ryan Brinkman** from Saint Mary's College of California will be joining us.

Ryan Brinkman currently serves as assistant director of admissions and regional recruitment coordinator for Southern California at Saint Mary's College of California. Ryan got his start in admission at Pepperdine University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in 2023 and his master's in 2025. Ryan's lifelong passion centers on increasing student access to higher education through any avenue possible and helping others to do the same.
