All Saints Day

The La Salle community recently gathered to celebrate a special All Saints Mass, honoring the countless individuals, both recognized and unknown, who have illuminated the path of faith, courage, and love for us. This significant feast encourages the faithful to draw inspiration from the saints' lives and embrace the call to holiness. The event served as a powerful reminder that all are called to sanctity whether students, teachers, parents, and workers. We honor the saints' connection with the entire faith community, living and departed, and seek to live in God's grace and truth.

The celebration began with a meaningful Call to Worship led by Mr. Norman, who set the tone by emphasizing that a saint is not a distant, untouchable figure but an ordinary person who repeatedly chooses to say "yes" to God's call to love in the everyday moments of life. He cited examples like St. John Baptist de La Salle, dedicated to educating the poor, St. Teresa of Calcutta, who served Christ in everyone, and the newly canonized St. Carlo Acutis, who used technology to share God's love.

During the Mass, the Celebrant Father Michael Ume of Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Catholic Church delivered a homily discussing the crucial role of saints in the church and reminded the community that holiness flourishes in our everyday actions and relationships and in our classrooms, homes, and service to others. Both the profound reflection on the lives of the saints and the communal celebration of the sacred mysteries served as a powerful reminder of our connection to the saints and the universal call to live lives of purpose and grace.

Thanksgiving Prayer Service

Our community recently gathered for a meaningful Thanksgiving Prayer Service centered on the theme "**Seasons of Change**." This reflective event invited students and mentors to contemplate the moments of growth, challenge, renewal, and transformation that shape our lives, reminding us that God's presence guides us through every season.

The service began with an inspiring activity using coffee filters and markers. Students were asked to color their filters, with each color symbolizing a different kind of change: blue for **healing**, green for **personal growth** and new beginnings, yellow for **gratitude** and celebration, and purple for **guidance**. This initial, personal act of reflection set a quiet tone, encouraging students to identify the specific season they are currently navigating.

This visual experience served as a powerful metaphor for life's changes, illustrating that transformation is rarely sudden; rather, it is a process where challenges, blessings, and small moments mix together to shape who we are becoming. The water symbolized **renewal** and God's active presence moving within us.

Following this activity, the community watched a video emphasizing how positive change often begins with small decisions, simple acts of kindness, or moments of choosing growth. This was followed by a heartfelt reflection from Mrs. Fitzsimmons, who shared her personal experience with the season of change, further connecting the event's theme to real life.

The "Seasons of Change" prayer service was a beautiful opportunity for the community to pause, reflect, and embrace the ongoing journey of transformation. It was a moving reminder to be grateful for the season we are in, the lessons it brings, and the continuous, purposeful work of growth within each of us.

Junior Retreat

La Salle High School Juniors embarked on a profound spiritual journey at their annual retreat, "Who do you say I am?" held from November 5-7, 2025, at Mount Kare in Wrightwood, CA. The retreat's mountain setting provided a secluded, immersive environment for focused reflection, taking students away from the daily demands of campus life. This three-day experience, centered around the scriptural question from Mark 8:27-29, was designed to guide students in reflecting deeply on their core relationships: with God, with self, with family, and with friends.

The retreat kicked off on Wednesday evening, following a charter bus trip, with an introduction to the theme and a focus on establishing a respectful and present community. The three-day schedule was intentionally structured with a blend of adult witness talks, self-reflection time, individual journaling, and shared small-group discussions, ensuring every student had multiple avenues for personal growth and engagement. The experience was marked with moments of meaningful prayer, noting how they see God reflected in them. The retreat was an opportunity for junior students to practice and foster community and silent prayer throughout the experience. The Junior Retreat was a powerful, transformative experience, fostering deeper self-awareness and stronger communal bonds as the students journey home and campus with a renewed sense of purpose.



60 Seconds of Service

Once a month our student body comes together to make bag lunches to donate to Union Station in Pasadena for families in need. This activity is hosted during lunch by our service team encouraging students to take just a moment out of their day to do something nice for someone in need that will go a long way.

Trunk or Treat

Trunk or Treat is a yearly tradition at LaSalle, where the faculty and staff decorate their trunks for the students to trick or treat out of. This year the staff dressed up as characters from Toy Story. This year we had some great trunks and a scary haunted house with lots of candy!

COUNSELING UPDATES

UC & Cal State Applications

The [University of California](#) application is currently available and the filing period is October 1st to December 1st. We encourage students to submit their applications before the Thanksgiving holiday to avoid the high volume of submissions in the last week of November and to be able to receive counseling support during school hours.

The [California State application](#) opens from October 1 to December 1st. We suggest students apply broadly to the CSU campuses. La Salle College Preparatory is considered a local high school to CSU Los Angeles and CSU Northridge which means our students will receive priority consideration to these campuses as long as they meet the [CSU requirements](#).

Private Schools

Most private colleges utilize the [Common Application](#).

Please check each out-of-state and private college's websites for their application procedures and deadlines.

Art Schools

If your student plans to apply to performing and/or visual arts programs, please make sure to review carefully the application requirements and deadlines for information on portfolio submissions, auditions, and/or interviews. The Association of Independent Colleges of Art and Design (AICAD) offers free portfolio evaluation and feedback to high school students, available [here](#).

Concourse Match Platform

Match powered by Concourse is a new program we rolled out to our Seniors. It is a reverse application where universities will review profiles and send offers to students every month. These are REAL admission and scholarship offers. The universities do not see the



student's personal contact information and the students cannot see which universities are using Match.

The philosophy behind Match is to introduce students to new university opportunities and get them to think outside of the box. For colleges, it allows them to search for students who may not apply to them in the traditional format or for them to fulfill specific enrollment needs on their campus.

SAT/ACT Testing

Seniors will have their last opportunity to take standardized tests in December. Please double-check with your college of interest on the last accepted test date as requirements vary. We recommend students also check the list of schools that are [test-optional](#) for the 2025-2026 year. **All Cal States and UCs are test-blind**, meaning that scores will not be considered for admission even if they are sent. Scores may be used for placement purposes.

The SAT will be offered here at La Salle as a convenience for our students. You can sign up at www.collegeboard.org for the following date:

- **December 6**

- **March 14**
- **June 6**

The ACT will be offered at La Salle as a convenience to our students, and you can sign up at act.org for the following date:

- **October 18**
- **February 14**
- **June 13**

FAFSA, CSS Profile, and Cal Grant GPA Verification

The 2026-2027 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is already open. Parents will complete it using their financial information from the 2024 tax year. Please check with your student's college of interest for the FAFSA deadline. The priority deadline is March 2, 2026, but we encourage families to complete it when it becomes available.

Please note that selected colleges may also require the CSS Profile, which is found in the student's College Board account. [Here](#) is the complete list of schools that require the CSS Profile.

La Salle has electronically submitted GPAs to the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) for all seniors. Cal Grant provides aid for California students planning to attend college in California. Students who submitted the FAFSA will automatically be considered for the Cal Grant. Please note that

the Cal Grant GPA differs from the one listed on the transcript. Once students have completed their FAFSA, wait one week, then create a [WebGrants account](#) to check the Cal Grant status. Please see your counselor with any questions.

CLASS OF 2027

February ACT

La Salle is a testing site for the ACT on February 14, 2026. Students may register to take the ACT with no writing on their own via myact.org. Once we receive the students' scores in late February, we will then issue a credit back to their tuition account. Please reach out to Mr. Hou at ohou@lasallehs.org if you have any questions.

Mock SAT & ACT

The best way to prepare is to practice. Open to all grade levels, the mock exams are an opportunity for students to "sit" and experience the test prior to taking the official exam. This will help students work on their pacing, endurance, and enhance their skills. Both the practice digital ACT and SAT will be offered online, and students may take the exam from the comfort of their homes. Students will receive their scores immediately following the exam. Parents and students may schedule a free individualized score review with Revolution Prep

Even if your student is a senior, it is still important to be at their best because their first semester grades are sent to private schools they are applying to, and all colleges expect that their applicants will demonstrate a strong senior year in high school.
