Senior Application Deadlines

College application season is underway! For seniors, please keep these important deadlines in mind:

- **Senior College Planning Survey — Due September 4**

Counselors are meeting with seniors in the order surveys were received. If students have not submitted theirs yet, please do so as soon as possible.

- **Letters of Recommendation & Brag Sheets — Due October 1**

Seniors should:

1. **Ask one teacher in person** for a letter of recommendation. A second teacher letter is only needed if a college recommends or requires one.

2. **Submit the teacher request in Scoir:**

My Colleges > Docs > +Teacher > Submit

3. Complete both brag sheets on the Scoir homepage:

- Teacher Letter of Recommendation Brag Sheet (students must complete both the Scoir request and Teacher Brag Sheet before their teacher can upload a letter).
- Counselor Letter of Recommendation Brag Sheet

***All recommendation requests and brag sheets are due October 1, regardless of their college application deadline.**

Exception: Students applying only to community colleges, CSUs, and UCs do not need letters of recommendation or brag sheets.

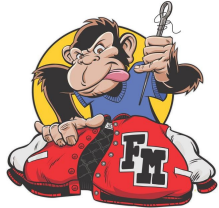
